As done by my predecessor, I grant the dispensation of your obligation to attend Sunday Mass and the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God throughout this pandemic.

We know through faith that Christ is with us and that we have the prayerful intercession of Mary, Joseph and all the Saints in our time of trial. Let us keep one another in our prayers as we beseech the Lord’s intercession in this time Holy Season, confident of his mercy and love. Merry Christmas! May God bless you and your family.
